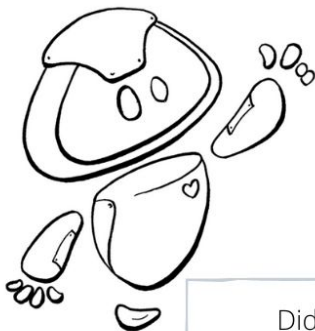
GOOD FRIDAY

Help the Grubs to remember Jesus' sacrifice for us by coloring in the picture.

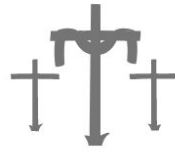


SPECIAL MEMORY VERSE:

Did you know that some sources suggest that the day is called "good" because it is a church or a "holy" day. Others suggest that it comes from the words "God's Friday".

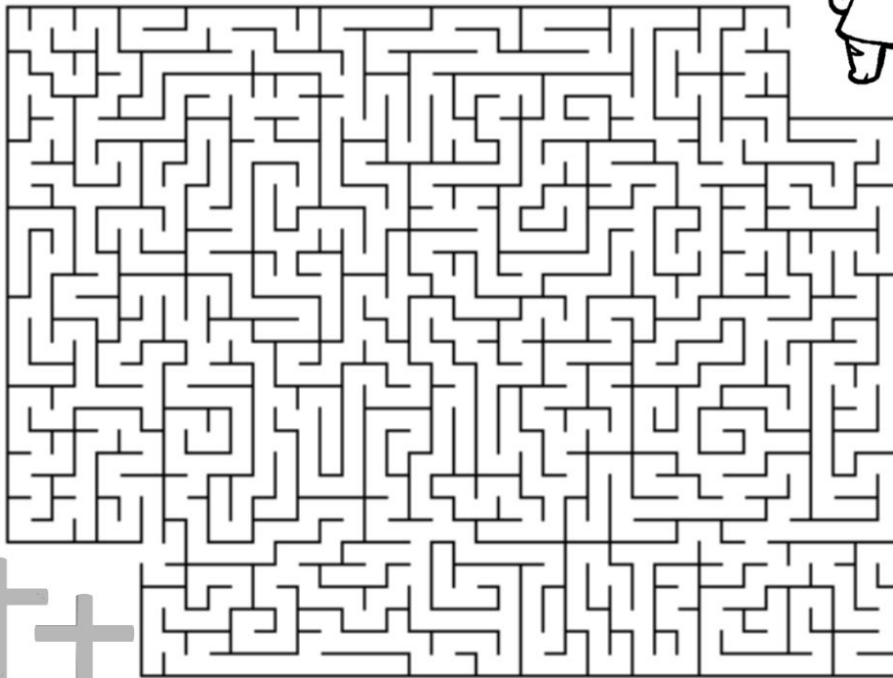
Good Friday Readings:
