

This summer, (July and August 2024) LLL Canada will be partnering with a congregation in Canada and help young adults to assist with English as a Second Language programs. Applicants will be supported in their training* and all arrangements will be made for them to serve on site for two weeks.

January 2025, LLL Canada will partner with Team Zion, a long-term mission team with service to Nicaragua and help young adults to assist with Vacation Bible School in the international mission field. Applicants will be supported in their training* and all arrangements will be made for them to serve on site for two weeks.

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APPLICATION PROCESS

- Letter of Recommendation: Applicants are required to submit a letter of recommendation from their Pastor, affirming their commitment to the faith and suitability for participation in the mentorship project.
- 2. Letter of Support from Home Congregation:
 Applicants will provide a letter from their home congregation confirming a financial commitment to support a portion of the program costs to demonstrate both the applicant's and congregation's dedication to the project. **
- 3. Letter of Expression of Interest: Applicants are asked to submit a letter expressing their interest in the mentorship project, outlining their motivations, goals, and expectations for participation.

*Coordination and support for travel, accommodations, pre-trip training will be arranged by LLL Canada

**costs will vary by program so financial support will be based on the program and congregation

With Canada experiencing high rates of immigration from non-English speaking countries, we see an opportunity to serve our immediate communities through ESL programs. Young adults will be trained and sent to assist congregations in teaching ESL during the summer season. This initiative not only benefits attendees by improving their English language skills, but also provides an opportunity to witness Jesus' love for others while fostering relationships as they integrate into Canadian society.

We firmly believe that expanding our youth and young adult programming in the areas of global and local missions will have a profound effect on the lives of participants, their mentors, and those they serve.
